### THE EAST COKER BULK OIL PURCHASE SCHEME

When I canvassed opinion at the end of 2010, the majority of people decided that a top-up in January/February and a fill-up in July/August was the best way to schedule orders. This January's order was extremely well subscribed. It ran to 23,500 litres in 32 drops, so participants were topping-up on a grand scale. As agreed, there will not be an order in April and the next order will be a fill-up in July or perhaps August.

As I've said before, the scheme is a great benefit to those who order less than 1000ltrs. In January, larger orders saved almost 2p per ltr over quoted prices for 1000+ltrs and smaller orders (the majority) almost 4p over the price for less than 1000ltrs. So we all helped each other. Could this be the Big Society in action!. Before you ask, we just do the donkey-work; collecting the requirements, ringing round the suppliers and placing the order and you pay the supplier directly. If you have already taken part and found it worthwhile, encourage your friends and neighbours to join in. The more we can order, the better the price.

### EAST COKER PRESERVATION TRUST

On the 1 March, a packed meeting at the East Coker Hall organised jointly by the Parish Council, ECPT and the East Coker Society heard about the latest changes in SSDC's Draft Core Strategy and how the Council were about to embark on a series of Area Committee meetings leading up to the decisions which will be made by the District Executive on 26 March and the Full Council at their meeting on 23 April. These decisions will finalise the version of the Core Strategy which will be published in May for six weeks public consultation.

East Coker people have attended all four of the Area Committee meetings, and we have been able to observe how all the councillors are reacting to and debating the draft proposals which have been put in front of them. It is evident that there is a significant level of discomfort with both the total housing numbers they are being asked to consider and the strategy to build 2500 houses in a single urban extension to Yeovil. At the Area South meeting there were many excellent verbal representations made by members of the public and these will need to be repeated for the wider group of **all** the councillors at the Full Council meeting.

We all need to continue to make our views known and it is particularly important that there is a strong attendance at the Full Council meeting to demonstrate the depth of concern over SSDC's intentions. This meeting will take place at the Gateway Centre at 10.00am on 23 April. More information about this meeting will be circulated before that date. Please note the new start time for this meeting – it is not as previously shown on SSDC website.

In the six week public consultation period it will be essential that as many people as possible make written, or online, representations about the published version of the Core Strategy. These will be sent direct to the Planning Inspector and so it is crucial that he/she sees the evidence and the strength of feeling which exist against the Council's plans. This may seem a bit repetitive but none of the 3,000 representations which have been made so far will be carried forward after the final plan is published.

In parallel with all this activity, we have been continuing discussions with legal advisers in preparation for a legal challenge which is likely to be needed if SSDC continue to pursue their strategy which is based on deeply flawed evidence. As you will be aware, these challenges in the High Court can be very costly so it is essential that we prepare for major fund raising in the coming months.

Many thanks to all of you who have pledged financial support for the legal challenge. We will keep you informed of progress on this front. We will still need to raise significant funds so if you have any suggestions or opportunities for fund raising and donations to support the Trust's work, please address them to the treasurer, Richard Vanderpump.


## EAST COKER SCOUT GROUP

### EAST COKER PARISH COUNCIL

In January, several members of the public attended the meeting and supported the idea of producing a **Neighbourhood Plan** (NP). This is part of the government's Localism Act encouraging the 'Big Society' notion of local people being involved in planning the future of their local areas. Members of the Parish Council have attended training on the production of the NP and as a result of advice given, the Parish Precept will include funding to support this activity. The writing of the NP will be facilitated by the Parish Council, but will need to involve the participation of as many community members as possible. As our plans proceed, we will make contact with you, but if you would like to register an interest in being involved, please contact Pauline Gubbins, Parish Clerk <u>clerk@eastcokerpc1.wanadoo.co.uk</u>; 862062.

We are very pleased with the **new path** joining the car park to the Pavilion and we have received encouraging comments from those who have used it. The wider path allows people to walk side-by-side as well as making the use of pushchairs and wheelchairs more possible. We managed to obtain funding for this venture from the **Awards for All grant of the Big Lottery**, which meant that our precious Precept funding was conserved. We are also improving the signs to remind dog owners of the need to 'scoop the poop' in order that we can all enjoy this wonderful area to the maximum. If you or your club or society has ideas for enhancing our Parish further, please let Pauline Gubbins know and we will do our best to seek external funding.

Plans are moving ahead for our **Queen's Jubilee celebrations** on the weekend of 2 - 4 June, and we are pleased to hear that the Queen will be visiting the South West on 1 - 2 May visiting Sherborne, Salisbury, Crewkerne, Yeovil and Exeter. Many clubs within the Parish are meeting regularly to plan the Fete and evening activities for Monday 4 June. We are considering how to commemorate the Jubilee and a variety of options is being considered including tree planting and the production of superior quality signage to direct people to landmarks within the village.

**Councillor Binny Bennett** visited East Coker Primary School to discuss the District Council's planned Urban Extension and there was much interest and lively debate from the children. We hope to involve the children appropriately in Parish Council matters now that **Councillor Kath Wilson** has become a local authority governor at the school.

Kath attended the Somerset Together (Local Strategic Partnership) conference on health and well-being. The proposed changes of the Health and Social Care Bill were explained as they affect South Somerset. A Shadow Health and Wellbeing Board for Somerset was set up in October 2011 and will be fully constituted by March 2013, when the legislation is in place. Data suggest that by 2027, most of the South Somerset area will have more than 24% of its population aged over 65 years. In 2010, male life expectancy in South Somerset was 80 years and female life expectancy 84 years (both are higher than the national average).

On 1 March, the Parish Council, in collaboration with the East Coker Preservation Trust hosted the second village **Open Meeting** to update parishioners on the SSDC draft Core Strategy. This was attended by almost 400 people and was followed by a very strong attendance at the SSDC Area South meeting on 7 March. Our joint efforts will continue in order that we secure the best possible outcome for the community.

We are informed that Somerset County Council has completed the **traffic survey**, but details are not yet shared with us.

**Councillor Bridget Sugg** organised a **Litter Pick** on Saturday 10 March and after her splendid bacon rolls, a trusty group set off to clean up the roads and lanes around the Parish. Many thanks to all those who gave up their Saturday morning to make our parish look even lovelier. Anything we can do to encourage people not to drop litter is most important. From an early age we learn either to hurl refuse anywhere or dispose of it responsibly. However if we all pick up litter when we see it, the beauty of our Parish will be maintained.

In spite of the withdrawal of funding from the County Council, it has been decided to continue to work with other parishes in the employment of the **Lengthsman** who undertakes numerous jobs to keep the Parish maintained.

The Parish Council team enjoyed participating in the **Village Quiz** on 10 March, even though they found many of the questions very challenging!! Well done to all those involved in the organisation.

### WHEN CRICKET WAS CRICKET

Many moons ago, the captain of my college's cricket eleven was a big and burly Yorkshireman called Robin Feather, who later skippered the Yorkshire second eleven, and whose habit it was when things in the field were going against us to shout at us, in Yorkshire-speak, "Pray for rain, lads". Oddly enough, this device sometimes worked, and fancy grew that Robin had found a way of spooking the opposition team into making a mess of their game. The skipper, however, was adamant that his prayer didn't work.

Well, of course it didn't work. The Almighty has bigger things to worry about. But after last year when the average rainfall was no more than 30ins (76.2cm), there is every sign that 2012 is going to be as dilatory, or perhaps even more so. In January, we had 2¼ins (5.7cm) at North Coker Hall; in February no more than ¾in (1.9cm), and with four apparently sunny days to go until the end of March, we have recorded only 1¼ins (3.2cm), for a first-quarter total of 4¼ins (10.8cm): multiply that by four and you have a prospective annual rainfall of noticeably below 20ins (50.8cm). There is nothing I can do beyond encouraging the residents of East Coker to murmur, every day if they will, "Pray for rain, lads (and lasses) until we get some"! And may endless rain-storms drown the malevolent intent of the urban 'extensionists' and the developers!!
