At present, South Somerset District Council is considering an outline planning application from John Bishop's company. This application covers many aspects of how the development will impact on the local environment and is therefore, very complex.

It is currently under consideration by the Council's Planning Department, and they are forecasting they should be ready to report back to Councillors sometime in June. They will then consider the application and vote on it around the same time. I will keep you informed and up to date as much as possible.

THE EAST COKER BULK OIL PURCHASE SCHEME

In January, 49 of us ordered 41,250 litres of oil at 21.95ppl. As it turned out, the sensible ones were those who filled their tanks. The asking price then was 23.70ppl and had just started to rise. It's now (22 March) 31.64ppl. We used to say 'Fill up in the summer and top up in the winter'. Now I wouldn't like to guess where the price will be by the summer. Our next order will be in July/August.

Before you ask, I just do the donkey-work; collating the requirements, ringing round the suppliers and placing the order. You pay the supplier directly. Please note that with some suppliers the delivery note is also the request for payment and there may be a surcharge if you don't pay promptly. If you have already taken part and found it worthwhile, encourage your friends and neighbours to join in. The more we can order, the better the price.

The Playgroup children have had a busy Spring Term. They have investigated the Five Senses in the first half-term and explored Natural Materials in the second half-term. The children enjoyed raising funds with a Sponsored Pancake challenge in February, and will be having a Easter Egg hunt with a coffee morning for parents and carers on the last day of term. Over the past months, an exciting project has been evolving at the Pavilion. A grant secured from to Big Lottery Fund has been used to fence an outside play area, with an inner section created to provide a mud kitchen play area and raised beds in which the children will be able to grow fruit and vegetables. This will greatly enhance the children's play and learning opportunities, and enable them to develop valuable life skills. The playgroup extends many thanks to all involved in this beneficial project.

Fundraising is essential in supporting the playgroup, and will enable the playgroup to maintain the outside space and facilitate the children's educational summer outing. Our next fundraiser is the Annual Playgroup Fair which will be held on the afternoon of Saturday, 21 May 2016 from 12.30pm to 3.30pm, at the Pavilion, Long Furlong Lane, East Coker. Children can join us from the age of 2½, and Early Years Entitlement is available in the funding period after their third birthday. We are open during term time, with sessions every week day morning, and an afternoon session on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday and optional lunch cover for children who like to bring a packed lunch.

If you are seeking childcare for your 2-year old, East Chinnock Under-Fives playgroup accepts children from their 2nd birthday to starting school. For the past few years, the staff at East Coker Playgroup also staff East Chinnock Under-Fives Playgroup, and both Playgroups feed into East Coker Primary School. This began when East Chinnock Under-Fives Playgroup was threatened with closure due to staff shortages, and has worked to the benefit of both groups, each maintaining their own committee and identity. East Chinnock Under-Fives Playgroup is a smaller group, and this can be a great benefit to the younger children.

EAST COKER SCOUT GROUP

This term's activities seem to revolve around making things; the Hut has been filled with clay models by the Beavers and wooden bird boxes from the Cubs. The Scouts successfully passed their Emergency Aid Stage 3 badge and have been cooking on hike stoves.

The Scouts have entered the Fox Trophy in April - this is a weekend competition hike where they carry all their equipment over a 15 - 25 mile course. They are self-sufficient for food, tents and cooking equipment. Another important aspect is to complete a log book detailing their hike with route, observations, menus, team members and equipment.

For the Cubs it is the 100 Year Celebration since the section was started. They have a three-day camp over the May Bank Holiday weekend, with activities ranging from monkey rope bridge to fair trading to circus skills. It's great to welcome Glen as our new Assistant Cub Leader.

Our numbers continue to be high, with all sections nearing capacity - the Hut can get very noisy when full of boisterous, excited young people!

Which brings us to the Hut extension. It will give us new toilets, cloakroom and entrance and allow us to create a 'quiet room' where the current kitchen is. This will give a great lift to the Hut and allow us to

provide a wider range of activities at the same time. We now have the funds to build the external aspects – that is, to create the waterproof outsides - and we hope to start the building work in May/June. This element should take about 3 to 4 weeks. We are continuing to raise the money to allow us to knock through into the main building and complete the interior fittings.

We are extremely grateful for all the support from the village - including the recent Village Quiz winners - as there is much yet to be updated within the Hut.

EAST COKER NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN - NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN UPDATE APRIL 2016

Work has progressed over the past months on the continuation of the East Coker Neighbourhood Plan. The Plan Group has been busy writing the draft plan, developing and fine tuning the policies relating to housing, employment and business, community facilities, the built and natural environment and transport that will help guide decisions on future planning applications. A draft document has been presented to SSDC and they are happy in principle with our work. It is available for you to read but will be posted on the Parish Council website as soon as it is reviewed following our recent Open Day Event.

A survey has also been undertaken to identify possible areas of 'Local Greenspace' within the village that will be identified in the Plan and we have met with Somerset Highways to discuss traffic issues which will be included.

A schedule of projects and actions is also being drawn up to go with the Plan, based on ideas put forward by the community and developed by the Plan Group, and which could include ideas for:

- Improved Footpaths and Signing
- An information and interpretation plan to include panels about East Coker's history to supplement existing ones, as well as updates of guided walks leaflets
- A car park for school drop off/pick up
- Speed control signs at the entrances to the village
- Other ideas for projects would be welcomed

We held a Parish 'Drop in Day' event on 19 March when a new exhibition was on show together with copies of the current version Draft Plan, although this is still very much 'work in progress'. Over 50 people attended this event, which helped explain the Plan and ensure as many people as possible were well informed. Please let me know if you would like to see copies of any items that were on display.

The next stage will be for the Plan to be subject to formal Consultation with a wide range of authorities and agencies as well as the public. This will be for a six week period probably during May and June. It will then be submitted to South Somerset District Council who will arrange for the Plan to be 'Examined' by an independent Planning Inspector and also subject to a local Referendum when over 50% of those voting have to support the Plan, for it to be finally adopted or 'Made'. This does all take time, but the Plan will then be used by both the Parish and District Councils to help determine planning applications within the Parish. The Neighbourhood Plan will then be part of the overall 'Development Plan' for the area, so you can see how important it is.

CPRE SOMERSET CALLS FOR A GREEN BELT AROUND YEOVIL

The Campaign to Protect Rural England Somerset Branch ('CPRE Somerset') is calling for the creation of a Yeovil Green Belt to ensure that the town continues to enjoy sufficient green amenity space, and to prevent unrestricted urban sprawl resulting in the merger of the town and its surrounding hamstone villages - villages that at the moment add very much to the character of this part of South Somerset.

Yeovil and the Yeovil area in South Somerset face unprecedented development pressures, particularly from new housing. The District Council's Local Plan provides for 15,950 houses in South Somerset, with over 1,500 houses allocated for Yeovil in two urban extensions at Upper Mudford and Keyford. This is on top of the hundreds of houses already built or for which permission has been granted. Currently the District

Council is also facing a plethora of speculative applications on sites not allocated in the Local Plan because it does not have the required 5-year housing land supply, despite the adopted Local Plan being only a year old. The Broadacres site in North Coker is just the latest example of this.

CPRE nationally is campaigning for the protection of existing Greenbelts and the creation of new ones. There are no Green Belts in Somerset and they are now needed because of the amount of development taking place. Councils need to ensure that all these new houses have sufficient amenity and green space, and not just within developments such as play areas and similar. People also need to be able to get out into the countryside proper and Green Belts are a town's 'green lungs'. South Somerset District Council needs to factor a Yeovil Green Belt into its review of the Local Plan, a review that is currently under way.

The support of local parish councils and Yeovil Town Council is also being canvassed. So far, East Coker, Mudford, West Coker and Brympton Parish Councils have all indicated their support in principle to a Yeovil Green Belt. Other parish councils are still to be seen.

This campaign is at a very early stage. Where precisely a Green Belt would go, how far it would extend etc. are all 'work in progress' for future discussion.
