EAST COKER VILLAGE HALL CHARITABLE TRUST

We are pleased to report that the installation of replacement main entrance doors was completed during February. This has resulted in noticeably improved insulation and easier access for users as they no longer have to manually unlock and lock the front entrance doors.

Many of you will be aware that the roof is no longer fit for purpose. As mentioned in the last copy of the East Coker Society Newsletter, options for the repair/replacement of the roof had been under investigation for several months. Investigations undertaken, involving considerable time and commitment by some committee members, have resulted in several quotations and options. A final decision will be taken by the Hall Trustees, following which we very much hope that work will commence later this year.

Grants have been, and are being, applied for. The anticipated cost of these works and improvements is circa £110,000. Any help towards raising funds for this project will be greatly appreciated, as will any donations towards the project. Your Village Hall is used by a variety of organisations and classes and for village events. We are extremely fortunate to have such a facility, which the trustees are keen to maintain and improve to as high a standard as possible.



This year, the Gardening Club is sponsoring a sunflower plant competition for the **East Coker Flower and Produce Show.** We hope that this will encourage youngsters to enter the show. Seedling plants, free of charge, will be available at the Plant Sale on Saturday 11 May, from 10.00am. There will be a limited number of plants, which will be distributed on a first come, first served basis.

We try to provide a varied programme during the year. We are always happy to welcome visitors and new members; whether or not you are interested in gardening

or would just like to join a group of friendly, sociable people. *The Propagator*, a free newsletter containing Club news, notes of gardening events, tips, etc is distributed via email, with hard copies available at each

meeting for those not on email. During the growing season, there is a produce stall, stocked by members with plants and produce. Vouchers offering discounts on seeds, seed potatoes, young plants and seedlings are available during January and February, with offers on spring bulbs and over wintering onions and shallots come summer. Bulk order discounts are available to members during January with special order forms for sundry goods, such as compost.

Twice a year, there is a growing competition with plug plants being distributed in the spring and bulbs in the autumn for the competition. Day trips are arranged to places of interest.

We are a friendly lot – why not join us for an enjoyable, sociable evening? You do not need to be good at gardening; talks cover a wide variety of subjects. The annual subscription is currently £20, with subs of £2 per meeting. Visitors £5. Dawn Gorman is Poetry Editor of Caduceus magazine, presents West Wilts Radio's The Poetry Place, and works with poetry as a mentor, workshop leader and in therapeutic contexts.

Dawn is widely published in journals and anthologies, including the prize-winning 'Aloneness is a Many-Headed Bird' (2020), a 'conversation in poetry' with Rosie Jackson, and the recent Poems in the Key of Hope, a 'deconstructed' anthology featuring poems printed on postcards, illustrated by Japanese artist Numata Kashu (Hedgehog, 2024).

Rosie Jackson is a poet and creative writing tutor living in Teignmouth, Devon.

Her latest collection is Love Leans over the Table (Two Rivers Press, 2023). Widely published, Rosie has won many awards, including Commended in the National Poetry Competition 2023 (out of 17,800 entries).

Other works include Aloneness is a Many-headed Bird (with Dawn Gorman, 2020), Two Girls and a Beehive: Poems about Stanley Spencer and Hilda Carline (with Graham Burchell, 2020)

Following on from our film 'One Life' in March, our last film for Spring 2024 will be in April.




'The Miracle Club' (2023).

As well as lay worship assistants, we are lucky to have a number of retired clergy living locally who have been given permission to officiate by the Bishop. This allows us to keep our regular services going, to offer one off and special services and to give pastoral support to anyone in the Parish.

As I write this update, we are in the middle of Lent, looking forward to Easter in a couple of weeks. We saw in the season with a Eucharist on Ash Wednesday and have continued to prepare for Easter with a series of Lent study and prayer meetings. Palm Sunday will be celebrated with a united Benefice service held in Hardington and on Easter Sunday Holy Communion will be celebrated in St Michael's. This year, during Holy Week (the week leading up to Easter) we will have visited a number of parishioners who are no longer able to get to church and will celebrate Holy Communion with them in their homes.


GOOSE SLADE FARM SHOP

EAST COKER PARISH COUNCIL

New SID (speed indication device) in the village of East Coker

Following concerns from residents and many, many months of efforts to complete the plan, East Coker now has a Speed Indicator Device (SID) to remind road users to check their speed. Periodically it will be moved to one of four locations around the village and hopefully encourage all to consider if their speed is appropriate; it will be set to the speed limit, but this is not necessarily the safe speed. Regardless of whether it displays a speed and appropriate message, the unit records non-identifiable information regarding speed and time. This data could be used to review the existing speed limits, but it is hoped that this is not required. The locations of the SID will be Higher Burton, Halves Lane, Coker Marsh Road, and Yeovil Road. Unfortunately, we cannot cover all residential areas due to roadside restrictions.

Council Tax reduction for low Income households

If you have to pay Council Tax and you are on a low income, you could get Council Tax Reduction. The rules depend on whether you are of working age, or you have reached the age for state pension.
