winning poems from previous years.


Tuesday 28 March

The Scouts had a busy November with County Challenge at Huish Woods, a District Hike based around Wells, air rifle shooting at Westlands and the Remembrance Parade. Our team in the County Challenge worked well together across various team building tasks spread over 5 hours. The District Hike covered 8 miles with broad sunshine, fog and rain – coats on, coats off.



Each section ended the term with Christmas activities – the Cubs went off to the pantomime at The Octagon, the Beavers decorated biscuits, the Scouts had a Nerf Evening and the Explorers made gingerbread houses.

The Beavers are starting 2023 with the Health & Fitness badge followed by Space activities. The Cubs will be learning about Chinese New Year, before moving on to the Digital Maker activity badge and a bingo night. Once again, we have had a very busy term with the return of many of our pre-covid activities which has been an absolute joy. In September, we held our 'Meet The Teacher' evening, and we also held a Saturday Open Morning for parents looking for schools in September 2023. It was really well attended. We have also had phonics workshops and end of year events for parents.

We have made several improvements to our school site, and this will be ongoing this year. We have had wall art installed, new outdoor seating and the removal of several old pieces of equipment. We are looking forward to the installation of our new outdoor furniture later this year along with improvements to our playground activities and library learning area – it is all go for our new site manager! In addition to this, we have made several improvements to our IT provision.

This term, the whole school theme has been 'Deadly Planet'. The infants have been learning about the Great Fire of London as part of their History and learned lots from our special visitor from the museum service. In Art, they have been looking at Kandinsky, learning a lot about mark making, painting and colour mixing!

In History, the junior children have been learning about why we were invaded by the Romans, Anglo-Saxons and Vikings and what legacy they left behind. They have also been learning about Mountains,

Volcanoes, Earthquakes and Extreme Weather. In Art and Design, they have been looking at The Great Wave, while in Design and Technology there has been a lot of sewing and a lot of volunteer adults supporting! Our Year 6 children have also had their residential at Great Wood, which is always a lovely week, despite the weather.

During the last part of the autumn term, the school held a very special Polar Express Day, and we were very fortunate to have a visit from the elf via a Wildcat helicopter courtesy of the RNAS Yeovilton. We also held our Christmas events for parents which included our Infant Nativity and Junior Carol Service in the church. It was a really lovely way to end the term.

The PTFA have also been exceptionally busy supporting the school and putting on events for our community. These have included Bingo, Santa's Grotto and many additional activities for the children, as well as supporting school events for parents such as our Saturday Open Morning. They make huge contributions to the life of the school, and the money they raise greatly improves our children's opportunities and experiences.

This term, we welcome our new Deputy Head, Lewis Bacon who has joined the school in Year 5/6. He has come from across the border (Dorset) and is settling in well to our East Coker ways.

The children's topic for Spring is 'Inventors', and they will be making toys, cooking and learning about Van Gogh and William Morris in art. Our Year 5 pupils will go on their local residential in March which is new for the school.

I would like to take this opportunity to say a huge thank you to all our volunteers who come in and support the children, from the PTFA to our local volunteers. We have volunteers who have helped with sewing, reading with children, changing library books, working with library ambassadors and general helping out in class. It is always greatly appreciated so thank you once again. If you are interested, please do contact the school.

THE EAST COKER ACTION GROUP

The East Coker Action Group was formed in 1986 by villagers who made voluntary donations in order to buy the field known as Pincushion Corner opposite Goose Slade Farm. At the time, the purchase was to avoid this green field site being developed.

Having achieved this aim, the field has been leased to local farmers for grazing on 2-year terms up to the present time and has preserved the rural character of the immediate area.

However, the Group has now achieved support to convert the field into a small woodland area of around 600 mixed tree species and shrubs. This is to improve the Environment, and to support the late Queen's Jubilee Green Canopy scheme.

Subsequently, the Group has liaised with the Woodland Trust and East Coker Parish Council to achieve this goal. The Group has been very grateful to both organisations for their strong support in this regard. The scheme will hopefully commence shortly with a mixture of indigenous tree and shrub species, with advice from the Woodland Trust.

This should in due course be not only an asset environmentally to East Coker (albeit without public access, due to insurance issues), but also as a suitable tribute to our late beloved monarch, Queen Elizabeth II.

We know it has taken longer than anticipated, but they are now almost complete, and we are hopeful that the new village stones will be in situ sometime in the spring if not before, so keep a look out.


