#### EAST COKER SCOUT GROUP

We are happy to be back to face-to-face scouting both outdoors and indoors. All our activities continue to be in accordance with our approved COVID-19 risk assessment and the Scout Association 'Back Together Safely' Readiness Level guidelines – this is now at Yellow level.



The Cubs have been canoeing at Sutton Bingham. You could not have asked for a better warm, sunny evening; many chose to get wet by practising turning over! The Cubs have also been to Pendomer Woods cooking on open fires and den building as well as hiking around the village.

The Beavers have been to Hardington Reserve for a hike, cooking at the hut and making bird feeders. They have also been up to Ham hill for their Navigator badge. The Scouts used their pioneering skills to make thrones for the two patrol leaders and have lit fires using flint and steel at Mike's Woods before cooking sausages and marshmallows. We were pleased to support Year 6 at East Coker School with tents for their sleep out; the Scouts took the tents down and packed them away on the Friday evening.

The Scouts have had their first East Somerset District event since 2019. Two teams attended the District Day Hike, starting and finishing at the top of Ham Hill. This meant at the end of 7.5 miles, a steep ascent was necessary, but this made the rations eaten at the end taste even better.

We did a litter pick around the village in support of Keep Britain Tidy's Great British Spring Clean. This activity idea came from the Parish Council, and we borrowed their picking kit.

At the hut, we have had new flooring fitted which makes the hut seem larger and we are trying to keep it pristine for a while but know that with all our activities this won't be for long.

With regards to fundraising, we have booked the Village Quiz for Saturday 13 November (further details nearer the time) but we are not planning a Jumble Sale for this year.

However, we have decided to stop newspaper collections. We thank Max for all his time over decades of collecting newspaper and taking it to Dorchester for recycling.

It's great to be back to our active programme - we hope to be camping again soon.

#### EAST COKER PRIMARY SCHOOL



As we reach the end of another very challenging and exceptional year, I would like to share with you the things the children and staff have been up to over the past few months.

Following the school reopening back in March, we have been focusing on supporting the children with their resilience, teamwork, confidence, and general well-being. As a result, our 'Wilderness' topic this term has been very practical and hands on. Activities have included survival weeks, weekly welly walks around the village and a wide range of outdoor education lessons as well as continuing our Well Being Wednesdays and Feel Good Fridays.

Government guidance has still meant we are working in many individualised 'bubbles' with very limited movement of staff and pupils. Play and lunches are still staggered, and zones have been set up for each class with only their designated staff member supervising. This does limit the school to what we can do but staff have become very adept at planning with social distancing in mind! This has meant that events have been done in a slightly different way, sometimes outdoors, sometimes through videos and sometimes through virtual meetings.

With the nicer weather, we have been able to go out more and have been able to plan some of our more normal events. Sadly, due to the guidance and our risk assessments, parents are still not permitted on site. This is frustrating considering the changes to restrictions when the children are out of school but with the numbers of children and staff we have on site, are very important to continue to have in place.

Staff have been very keen to plan and deliver as many of our normal events as possible. This has meant we have had to redesign them in order to meet risk assessments and DfE guidance, which has taken a considerable amount of extra time. However, we are very excited to share with you that so far this term we have taken part in our annual Enrichment week, which included taking part in the Od Arts Festival. Our Year 6 pupils attended an art workshop and visited the gallery in West Coker, while our remaining junior pupils walked up to Coker Court and the church to look at the art on exhibit. Our Year 6 children could not go on their residential this year, so we had a one-night camp out on the school field. Needless to say, we had some very sleepy pupils and staff the following day.

Our infants have also taken part in an African Drumming workshop day, which was, while very noisy for everyone in the school, really enjoyable and a great opportunity for our little ones to have some normality back. We have some fabulous dancers in our Reception class!!

We also have our Year 3 children taking weekly brass lessons in the hall with Mr Bertie and they sound amazing. They get to take their instruments home to practice, much to our parents' delight. At the end of the programme of lessons, we hope to record their playing and share that on our school website.

We still have many events left this term, despite the dwindling weeks, today Year 5 and Year 6 are playing rounders – socially distanced! We also have our special Year 6 end of year events and a virtual School of Rock event as well as a virtual Wizard of Oz experience!

Once again, I would like to say thank you to parents and the local community for all your support over such an incredibly challenging year and a half. I really do feel privileged to be head teacher of our wonderful school and supportive school community. Have a great summer!
