The 2024-2025 academic year has really flown by! Our pupils have been fantastic this year working hard and making a positive impact on our school community, ably supported by our amazing staff and volunteers.

School successes this year have included our very own **Kingfishers** Wrap Around Care provision. We have grown in numbers throughout the year. This is such an important school feature for new parents and has helped the school increase its numbers despite the fall in birth rates in Somerset. My favourite mornings are the Bacon Butty mornings and the Pizza Bagels in the afternoon are great as well!

'On the same site as the school, secure and safe area which my child has never been happier with wrap around care, the cost and flexibility works a lot better too. The staff are always on top of the activities with the children's needs. When collecting the children are always really happy and don't want to leave!' (After School Club Parent)



Once again, we will be running our Summer Club and this year with some very special days and the odd water fight!

We are delighted that we also have an external company delivering two weeks of digital learning and fun for all children, not just those who attend the school!

Other achievements this year include further improvements to the school grounds thanks to the wonderful Mrs Kennedy and her team of two Year 6 garden ambassadors, Alarna and Patrick. The School Council have planned the improvements to Glen's Garden, which is now a lovely, shaded seating area for children and staff to use. Mr Maddick has also been incredibly busy and has done a fantastic job helping Mrs Kennedy and building a shed or two and the odd tractor, decorating the school hall and putting up acoustic panels and a fair few other bits and pieces as well!

We have also had another busy year including some fantastic opportunities such as annual educational visits to: Melbury Estates; Foxdown Farm; the Bournemouth Symphony at Westlands Leisure; Monkey World; Exmoor Zoo; Sutton Bingham and a Year 5 and Year 6 residential. We have also taken part in author webinar sessions from Harriet Muncaster, David Walliams and Cressida Cowell. We have had visitors in from different professions, several theatre groups, futuristic VR science days, Royal Navy STEM day, as well as two very inspiring whole school workshops paid by the PTFA from an author and a poet.

Art experiences have included clay workshop sessions led by OSR projects in West Coker and the Od Arts Festival at Coker Court and the Chapel. We have also been very lucky to have had a week of free Mosaic www.eastcoker.com

workshops led by Dawn Handy, a South-West Mosaic Artist and member of Yeovil Creatives who is also a parent of the school. The children have made some mosaic flowers and insects to go on our outdoor Wilderness Wall which supported our topic this term.

In music, we have had a drumming workshop day, also paid for by the PTFA which was absolutely fantastic. In addition to this we have put on a Music Festival for the second year in a row, with children performing in bands with drummers, guitarists, key board players and of course singers!

We are now a Platinum School Games Award holder after having achieved the Gold Award consecutively for the last three years. We are also the South Somerset Area Cricket Champions and Cross Country Y2/Y3 boys champions. Two of our children ran in the Yeovil Counties event in cross country. We came second and third in the Quad Athletics in Year 3/4 and Year 5/6. In addition to this, we were joint winners in the new Hoop ball competition. Other events we have attended include football, boccia and motiv8 to name a few.

Forest school is going from strength to strength, and we have a recently extended the area and now have a large fire pit area, vegetable beds and soon we will also have a greenhouse. The aim is to increase the children's knowledge with planting and growing so they can become more sustainable as they grow older – so any keen vegetable gardeners who can help are warmly welcomed!!


A huge thank you to everyone in the community who has supported the school over the past year.



ST MICHAEL AND ALL ANGELS CHURCH

We have had a busy and varied few months recently and have plenty more going on for the rest of the summer.

In May, it was a great treat to host two Od Arts Festival events. The south transept was given over for the three days to a spectacular piece – Portal – by Jennifer Taylor. On the Saturday evening, Bristol based artist 'tlk' performed a mesmerising piece – The Butterfly Effect – that had voice, field recordings, electronic and instrumentals blending perfectly in and with the historic surroundings of the church. In June, somewhat more conventionally, St Michael's hosted the annual relicensing of churchwardens from across the deanery by the Venerable Ann Gell, Archdeacon of Wells. Our Summer Open Morning in June was also a great success. The opportunity to splat the vicar, tours of the church tower, produce sales, teas and a raffle brought in a great crowd and raised over £690 for St Margaret's Hospice. Thanks to everyone who supported.

Looking ahead

On Sunday **10 August** we will be holding a Pet Service at 11.00am. So come along and have your furry/feathered/woolly/scaly friend blessed by the vicar.

On Saturday **6 September** the Parnham Voices will be singing a free concert in the church at 4.00pm. The Parham Voices are a Beaminster based Capella Choir whose repertoire ranges from Tallis to Simon and Garfunkel (with everything in-between). The concert is a fundraiser for Julia's House Children's Hospice, so though admission will be free, donations will be gratefully received and will go to the charity. Teas will be served.

Finally, on **Sunday 28 September** at 5.00pm, to celebrate our patronal festival (the feast of St Michael or Michaelmas), there will be a service choral evensong. Sung by Sherborne Chamber Choir, this promises to be a rare musical treat for the parish church. After the service, there will be drinks and small eats – weather permitting - in the churchyard. All are welcome.


