VISIT TO SOMERSET HERITAGE CENTRE

On 17 September, a group of sixteen East Coker residents visited Somerset Heritage Centre in Taunton. This visit was offered in recognition of the donations which East Coker Society and East Coker Parish Council made to help secure retention of the Helyar and Walker-Heneage archives at the Centre for future public access.

Liz Grant (Archivist) treated us to a fascinating behind-the-scenes tour of this purpose-built facility which was opened in 2010 to house the County's Archives, Local Studies, Museums, Historic Environment and Archaeological and Natural History libraries. At the end of our visit, we were able to examine a selection of maps, documents, drawings, letters and other items from the Helyar and Walker-Heneage archive collections which gave a fascinating insight to the history of East Coker.

You can visit the centre and use the search room to consult these archives as well as other records, such as parish records; local government records; census records for Somerset; estate, manorial and family collections; Quarter Sessions and other court records; photographs; newspapers; books and published works relating to Somerset.

SAVE EAST COKER

Although a successful result has been achieved in restricting the proposed Keyford development to north of Plackett Lane (apart from the playing fields), we are still faced with the task of challenging details in the proposal which have an adverse impact on the area surrounding the site and on the roads which connect with it.

We also need to watch for new planning proposals that come forward which are not in the SSDC Local Plan, and ensure that they are challenged. This will be made more difficult by the fact that a Planning Inspector has now deemed SSDC does not have a 5-year housing land supply, that is. sufficient houses in the pipeline to cover the next five years. Without a 5-year land supply it becomes more difficult for the Council to resist planning appeals.

The best option for East Coker is to complete the Neighbourhood Plan, as this will provide a legal basis on which to fight future planning applications. All our focus is now on participating in the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group, to assist in the completion of the plan within the shortest realistic timescale.

The Save East Coker campaign will continue to scrutinise the Keyford plans over the coming period. Where appropriate, we will retain planning and legal expertise to help argue our case against the impact of the proposed development, so please continue to support us through the fundraising programme.

Quite regularly, I am showing some of our past pupils back around the school they used to attend and are planning for their own children's start. It is great to hear their memories of their own time here, invariably fond and happy memories.

Harvest will soon be celebrated in St Michael's, followed by pumpkins and fireworks before we plan Christmas in earnest. Teachers always have two Christmases, one which starts in early November rehearsing carols and making crowns, and then the real one at home with our own families.

After 35 years of teaching, more than half as a Headteacher, I shall be heading into retirement as the last chorus of 'O Come All Ye Faithful' fades away. It has been a huge privilege to have been at East Coker for the last part of my career and to have played a small part in the ongoing success of the school. The children have been a delight, nearly all the time, and my colleagues on the staff are a joy to work with.

I shall be leaving the school in very good hands; the governors appointed Mrs Jane Hesketh-Williams to be the new Headteacher. Jane is currently the head of Coxley Primary School, and I have no doubt that she will lead East Coker Primary to further success as the seasons continue to roll on.


