#### FILMFLIX - Films at East Coker Hall

Film nights, held on the last Wednesday of the month, recommenced in September with *Hidden Figures*.

Films for October and November:

- Wednesday 25 October: Their Finest is a British war comedy-drama film. The film tells the story
  of a British Ministry of Information film team making a morale-boosting film about the Dunkirk
  evacuation during the Battle of Britain and the London Blitz.
- Wednesday 29 November: Viceroy's House. The final Viceroy of India, Lord Mountbatten, tasked with overseeing the transition of British India to Independence, meets with conflict as different sides clash in the face of monumental change. Viceroy's House in Delhi was the home of the British rulers of India after 300 years, that rule was coming to an end. For six months in 1947, Lord Mountbatten, great-grandson of Queen Victoria, assumed the post of the last Viceroy, charged with handing India back to its people. The film's story unfolds within that great house. Upstairs lived Mountbatten, together with his wife and daughter; downstairs lived their 500 Hindu, Muslim and Sikh servants. As the political elite Nehru, Jinnah and Gandhi converged on the House to wrangle over the birth of independent India, conflict erupted. A decision was taken to divide the country and create a new Muslim homeland Pakistan. It was a decision whose consequences reverberate to this day.

There will be NO FILM in December. Showings recommence in January 2018.



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#### THE EAST COKER BULK OIL PURCHASE SCHEME - JULY 2017

It's becoming popular. In July, 69 of us filled our tanks with 62,950 litres of heating oil. That's about half as many again of us as ever before. The price was 33.70 pence per litre (+ VAT), that's 0.75ppl less than the best price for 1,000 litres, but 3.35ppl less than the worst. It looked as though prices in general were at rock bottom, so no generous discounts.

The company said they had never delivered to East Coker before and could they have a map. I did have a map which actually showed road and some house names, but the interesting bit was trying to explain that East Coker is a village of two halves, East and West, with a bit of road and a cemetery in between. And that's before you tell them to ignore the words North Coker on the map and forget West Coker altogether. Then there's Holywell, Helena Road and Sutton Bingham, which are off the map in different directions. I'm afraid I ended up saying they'd have to find Closworth for themselves, "It's on the far side of the reservoir".

The next order will be a top-up in January/February, when prices should have settled down after Christmas.




#### **BONFIRES**
