At the beginning of September, we all came together to start rehearsals for our Pantomime. Over the summer, we held our read through and auditions outside.


This year's Pantomime will be '**Oh no! Not another Pantomime!**' written by member, Jon Margetts. It will be produced and directed by his wife Amie.

EAST COKER PRIMARY SCHOOL



After a very long-awaited summer break, we have had a wonderful start to the school year, and it has been great to see everyone. We also welcome our lovely new Reception children and their families to East Coker School as well as our other additional new pupils and families across the school.

Everyone has settled in so well to school even though some of our 'normal' routines have not been in place for a long while.

This term, we have had our first whole school assemblies together in the school hall, including our Friday Singing sessions, for the first time in about 17 months. For our Year 1s, it was the very first time we have been together as a whole school in one room and it was so lovely to be able to get back to being one big family again.

We are well on the way to reinstating our Year 6 Ambassador roles. Our Year 6 ambassadors have the opportunities to run clubs as play and sports leaders. We also have ambassadors for the library, assemblies and school office, as well as subjects such as music and art. They also help our subject leaders gather evidence about how well the children learn, and they show visitors around the school. www.eastcoker.com

School council and buddies across the school have been set up and our buddy visits to Reception class by the Year 6 pupils has already taken place, as we no longer need to social distance (at the moment). The lack of need to socially distance has been a huge sigh of relief for us. As a school, we work extremely closely with all the other classes and we can now continue this huge part of normal school life, which has been missing for so long. It is never quite the same doing things 'virtually'.

Our Year 6's are off on their week residential in early October, the infants have a Pirate Day planned and our junior classes are visiting The Bristol Museum to attend an Egyptian workshop.

All of our Year 3 children have started their weekly Brass lesson with Mr Bertie in the school hall and I am sure the parents are looking forward to when they take their instruments home. It always amazes me as to how much the children learn in just 10 weeks of lessons. We are extremely grateful to the PTFA who fund the Year 3 brass lessons.

We have quite a few exciting new opportunities this year as part of our curriculum development and we are looking forward to seeing how these progress over the next few terms. This is part of our Recovery Curriculum plan to address any gaps in the children's learning which includes social and emotional learning, just as much as academic skills. We are introducing a new well established phonics scheme to school called Read Write Inc as well as a new personal development curriculum called 'Character For All' from Commando Joe's.

Once again, I would like to express how very grateful we are for all the support the parents and families have given the school, as well as support from the local community. We are now starting to welcome back our many helpers we had in school (pre Covid), who supported with reading, sewing and cooking, as well as helping our admin team. EAST CHINNOCK UNDER FIVES PRESCHOOL




MOBILE LIBRARY

As the nights are drawing in, it is a good time to be thinking of what you can do to avoid becoming a victim of burglary:

- Set a timer switch to turn your lights on when it gets dark unlit houses are a giveaway that no one is at home.
- Lock your doors, patios and downstairs windows even when you are in. Make sure you double check them again before you go to bed.
- If you have a burglar alarm, make sure you set it when you go out and also when you go to bed.
- Don't leave car keys, ID cards or valuables near windows, doors, or letterboxes, where burglars can reach through to steal them.
- Lock your garden gates and side entrances. Don't leave tools lying around in the garden which could be used to break into your home.
