MY soul, sit thou a patient looker-on; Judge not the play before the play is done: Her plot hath many changes; every day Speaks a new scene; the last act crowns the play.



It has been so lovely to welcome back all our families to East Coker Primary after the summer break, as well as welcome many new families who have joined us this term.

There was quite a bit of change for us in the summer term as many staff retired and our Deputy Head has had a recent promotion to Headship. This means changes for us with staffing across the teaching section and in the school office. Despite this, we have all 'hit the ground running' and the children (and staff) have settled in really well.

As usual, we have been exceptionally busy this term and have achieved lots already, considering it is only September. The children have had visitors from Yeovil Town delivering workshops and sports clubs to complement our school clubs. We pride ourselves in offering a well-rounded education, and our wide range of after school clubs help promote this amongst our pupils. This term, we offer coding club, STEM club, books and biscuits club, hockey, badminton, netball, archery, choir and a Lego club.

Our School Council, Year 6 Ambassadors and House Captains have all been elected and are fully embracing their new roles within the school. The School Council will be taking on the role of improving our lunchtime outdoor provision and running a social action project linked to the community. This may be supporting a local cause such as food poverty, homelessness, or mental health, or looking at environmental issues.

Our Year 6 residential is due to take place next week with a week at Great Wood Camp. We are excited to also be spending a day at Kilve. The children will be taking part in grass sledging, rifle shooting, archery, beach studies, climbing, swimming and much more. It will be a fun packed week – regardless of the weather forecast!

Our Year 4s are off to see 'Beauty and The Beast The Musical' in Bristol next week and we have just booked our Year 5 residential which takes place in March. It is so nice for things to be back to normal!

This week, we have hosted some Phonics Workshops for our parents to get an insight as to how we teach phonics at East Coker. We are currently delivering the Read, Write Inc. programme of phonics. We will be offering more workshops over the year for different subject areas.

Over the holidays, our new site manager has been busy making improvements to our school hall, and we are looking forward to the delivery of some very special wall art which will be installed later this week.

We will also be holding our first open morning for prospective parents for Reception in 2023 on Saturday 15 October from 10.00am-12.00pm, so please come along if you are looking for a place in Reception in September 2023. This will be a fantastic opportunity to have a good look around the site to see what we offer. Parents are then welcome to have a tour during the school day to see what it is like in action.

ROYAL MEMORIES BY MONICA

Little did I think when I wrote about the late Queen Elizabeth II's Coronation that her life was so near its end. I am so thankful she was able to celebrate her Platinum Jubilee. I shall always remember the broadcast she made to the nation on her 21st birthday dedicating her life, whether it be long or short, to serve the nation. I was struck by the massive task she had set herself at such a young age and what a faith she had. As many of the people have commentated recently, she had always been there, she was the one stable factor in a changing and often troublesome world. She carried out her words of dedication to the utmost possible limit. May she rest in peace and rise in glory.

Her death has brought back my memories of the death of her grandfather, George V and her father, George VI, and I am struck by how the world has changed. I clearly remember the night George V was dying, Mum came to tuck me up in bed and a cold tear fell on my face. I asked her what the matter was, and she said the King is dying but is sleeping peacefully.

Next day, Dad's first task was to start arranging for a wireless to be available in church so that many of those living in his village could hear the Funeral Service. Many did not have a wireless, and those that did had to take it up to the local garage to get it topped up with sterile water, I believe.

Later, when George VI died, I was working on my University Theses and when I went downstairs to make a coffee, Dad came out to tell me the King had just died suddenly in his sleep. From then, and in the following days, the only sound on the radio was solemn music, apart from the regular News.

I remember the new Queen was proclaimed from the Town Hall next day, and on the Sunday, we had a splendid service in church. Blackout curtains were cut up and everybody wore black armbands and black hats. Hats were a must for church in those days, and I was very proud of mine, contrived out of blackout material. We were still suffering from lack of resources, so nothing was ever thrown away!

The King's Funeral must have been broadcast, but the University had arranged for our group to visit an Approved School that day. As this had been difficult to arrange, we were told in no uncertain terms we must go or else...! We all trooped off on the local bus. When we got to our destination in the wilds of the country, the conductor said, "You will have to hitch a lift back to Leicester, this is the last bus of the day!"

Our hearts fell, there were over 20 of us but one of the boys took charge and said no girl was to go alone. The first car sailed past, next a farm flatbed lorry pulled up and the driver asked where we wanted to go. Luckily, he was going past the University and offered to take us home. As we climbed up onto the lorry, he said, "I think the straw is clean, I am going to pick up some sheep". It was clean but bitterly cold, however we did not mind, we got home!

What a change with the full coverage of the Funeral of the late Queen. I felt I was almost there, as if I was following the procession on foot. What memories will be passed on to future generations.
