A note about **Schoolbeanz**. This is a gardening club teaching children how to grow vegetables, flowers and how to garden to help nature with plenty of upcycled art and fun, run from their own children's allotment in the village of Chilthorne Domer.

We try to provide a varied programme during the year. We are a friendly lot, always happy to welcome visitors and new members; whether you are interested in gardening, are a complete amateur, have considerable gardening experience or would just like to join a group of friendly, sociable people. *The Propagator,* a free newsletter containing Club news, notes of gardening events, tips, etc is distributed via email, with hard copies available at each meeting for those not on email.

During the growing season, there is a produce stall, stocked by members with plants and produce. Vouchers offering discounts on seeds, seed potatoes, young plants and seedlings are available during January and February, with offers on spring bulbs and over wintering onions and shallots come summer. Bulk order discounts are available to members during January with special order forms for sundry goods, such as compost. Twice a year, there is a growing competition. Day trips are arranged to places of interest. We usually hold a plant sale in May each year.

You do not need to be good at gardening; talks cover a wide variety of subjects. The annual subscription is currently £25, with subs of £2 per meeting. Visitors £5. Meetings are held on the second Thursday of each month, commencing at 7.30pm (doors open at 7.00pm) in East Coker Hall, Halves Lane, East Coker unless otherwise indicated. #### EAST COKER FLOWER AND PRODUCE SHOW

Another successful Show, held on Saturday 16 August at East Coker Hall. It was a pleasure to welcome both regular and new exhibitors – 66 entered, several less than last year, but with a total number of 499 (slightly up on last year) entries in the various classes. Despite difficult growing conditions, gardeners managed to put on a good range of exhibits in the vegetable, fruit and flower classes.

It has obviously been an excellent year for tomatoes (heat and sun worshippers!) and apples (which have probably benefitted from last year's rain). Flowers had noticeably suffered from the heat. Although fewer entered the children's classes exhibits were imaginative and skilfully done. Entries in the "Homecrafts" section were considerably up on 2024. I cannot recall so many entries in the jam, jellies, chutney and pickled vegetable classes. "Arts and Crafts" classes were well supported. "Photography" entries were down. Sadly, entries in the "Floral Art" classes were significantly down. Although this is called floral art, basically it is arranging flowers in a container of some description. We aren't looking for floristry standards – just something attractive and a bit of imagination - please do think about entering.

Having reviewed the wine classes in 2024, to include homemade cordial and homemade spirit, it was pleasing to note that, again, entries have increased.

#### EAST COKER PRIMARY SCHOOL

Respect, Determination & Courage, Compassion & Collaboration, Independence & Creativity

Once again, we have had a great start to our new year. It has been so lovely to see all the children after a well-earned summer break. We also welcomed our new Reception parents and new families to East Coker Primary School in September. The children in Reception have settled in so well it feels like they have been in school far longer than they have.

We have had a busy summer holiday making improvements to the school which we are unable to do at other times in the school year without disrupting learning. We have had several classrooms decorated, a completely new floor has been put down in Eagles class, a new gazebo has been built for Reception thanks to funds from the PTFA, as well as a really good tidy and clear out.

As is usual for us over the summer holidays, we also held our own Summer Club for the first two weeks of the summer break. This was well attended, and the children enjoyed the freedom of having the school to themselves. They particularly enjoyed the water fight!

This term, we have a brand-new catering service from FIGS. The children now have the option of a lighter meal such as panini's, baguettes and soup! The variety on offer and the quality of the hot meals is fantastic. The children have been very complimentary.

We have an exciting term ahead. Our Year 4s went to the Bristol Hippodrome to see 'The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe' and our Year 6 pupils will be going on a week-long residential to Okehampton in October. Some year groups will also be attending Forest School and Swimming this term, and our Choir will be very busy performing at a few extra events this year.

This year, we will be looking at the following themes: Treasure Hunters, Super Structures and Festivals. This term, the children will be finding out about William Dampier and Ancient Egypt as well as completing a local study, finding out about the UK and its cities, and naming key features such as our oceans and continents. We will be developing our understanding of mark making and drawing as well as working with clay.

Kingfishers Club, our breakfast and after school club, has had a very successful first year with numbers going from strength to strength. This week, the children enjoyed having bacon butties for breakfast and after school they have enjoyed fruit kebabs, pizza bagels and cheese toasties! If you feel you would like to offer your expertise to support the school in any way, we would be more than happy to hear from you. We welcome adults to support with hearing children read and any gardening gurus who can offer some time each week to work with our gardening ambassadors.

If you would like to help at a more strategic level, we have a vacancy in our governing body. Meetings are once every three months at the school. Here we discuss the strategic direction of the school alongside school improvement.

#### ST MICHAEL AND ALL ANGELS CHURCH

Our regular pattern of parish and benefice services carried on through the hot summer. A highlight was the wonderfully bonkers Pet Service in August. As well as countless dogs of all shapes and sizes (all impeccably behaved), we were joined by an 85-year-old tortoise. A truly blissful occasion and a great opportunity to celebrate and give thanks for the special part our pets and animals play in our lives.

In September, we hosted the Parnham Voices, a Beaminster based Capella choir, for a tea time concert. We were the 4<sup>th</sup> destination on their Annual Choral Safari, raising funds for Julia's House Children's Hospice. We raised £179 for the charity from donations and takings for teas and coffees. Thanks to everyone who supported the event.

This summer, the church was the venue for a baptism of Averi Gullis and for a joyous and sumptuous service to bless the marriage of Hector Coles and his lovely wife Natassja.

The summer brought sadness too. Jacqueline Clough, a lay worship assistant, a dear friend to so many of us, and a stalwart of the church community, died after a short illness. I write this update the evening before her thanksgiving service and, as a fitting tribute to someone who gave so much to the church, our talented and creative team of flower arrangers have decked St Michael's out beautifully in readiness.

Another villager whose life was inextricably linked to St Michael's, Bob Mead, also left us this summer. As well as being village treasures, Bob and Gloria gave so much to the church and were such an important part of the worshipping community. Bob's funeral, which as I write was only a few days ago, was an unforgettable occasion. Borne to the church and then to the cemetery on a trailer pulled by his first tractor, his coffin was adorned with a wreath that included carrots and parsnips as well as beautiful flowers, alongside his trademark deerstalker.

On 28 September, the Sunday closest to the feast day of St Michael (Michaelmas), we celebrated our patronal festival. The main event was choral evensong with Sherborne Chamber Choir. It is rarely that choral evensong is sung in a parish church, and we are so pleased to have had such a distinguished choir visiting for the occasion.


#### THE CHAPEL AT EAST COKER HALL

#### Keeping our Parish beautiful

As we enter into the latter part of summer, with the amount of rain and sun we have had – all our hedgerows and lawns are growing like crazy!! At our latest meeting, we had a discussion on some of the overgrown hedges and pathways within our parish. Bird nesting months are typically between March and August, so after 1 September, could we please ask that if your hedges back onto public roads, pavements or pathways, they are cut back to allow pedestrians to pass and vehicles and cyclists to be seen.

Also, if you have a grass verge outside of your property, if possible, could you keep it mown, weeded and tidied.

#### Village Picnic

#### **Cemetery works**

If you have been in or around the Cemetery, you will have noticed a lot going on recently. There have been some tree works and clearance of overgrowth. Licences to have badgers removed from the land and more works to overgrowth and trees to follow. New trees will be planted that will complement the use of the land. This is all in aid of making sure we can have more plots in the cemetery in years to come.

#### Defibrillator

There is now a defibrillator at the Café for use in the village. Please note this is only accessible when the Cafe is open. The Café opening times are Tuesday- Friday 9am-4pm and Saturday 9am-12pm.

#### SID Update for Yeovil Road 6 – 18 September

Reading the following, it is important to remember that the primary purpose of the SID (Speed Indicator Device) is to remind road users of their speed when entering the potentially hazardous area of our village. The consequences of speeding are still the responsibility of the driver. Those who chose to ignore the reminder are a minority of road users, but it only takes one inconsiderate individual to cause a fatality.

In addition, the SID's settings must be 30mph although this is rarely a safe speed in much of the village area. Given the location by Tellis Cross, many of the vehicles would have been slowing for the turn in, for oncoming traffic or the reduced 20mph school zone. Similarly, those leaving Tellis Cross would have given a 'false' reading. Without these factors skewing the results, the speeds for many would be higher.

During this time, 7,381 vehicles entered and 10,831 left the village along this route. 90% of inbound and 80% of outbound were below 30mph. Incoming, and scarily 132 outgoing, vehicles were recorded over 40mph. The speed limit only changes to 40mph after regular housing and the Longlands Lane turn for very good reason, but the importance of this is clearly lost on 1 in 5 drivers who are already over 30mph as they pass Tellis Cross. Highest recorded speeds are not openly shared as this can encourage some towards recklessness, but they are recorded at times of day when plenty of others would be around, for example, afternoon school and early evening.

#### 20mph School Zone

With the start of the new school year, it is worth noting that when in operation the 20mph extends from one sign to the next, that is, leaving the village on Yeovil Road cars should do 20mph up to Tellis Cross if the lights were flashing on the way in. We are still awaiting an additional flashing 20mph school sign from the County Council on the approach from Higher Burton, but this is on the way.
